NEW MARICOPA COUNTY COURTHOUSE FEATURES ADVANCED ELECTRONIC WAYFINDING SYSTEM

PHOENIX, Arizona (February 20, 2012) — The new Maricopa County Court Tower was dedicated Tuesday, and features a host of electronic wayfinding technologies, provided by Infax Incorporated of Duluth, GA, to help courthouse patrons navigate the facility.

Just inside the courthouse, twelve 57-inch liquid crystal displays will list participants in each day's cases, and direct them to their courtroom. A small display outside the door to each courtroom confirms patrons have reached the correct destination, and allows judges to present messages on the displays outside their courtroom or courtrooms.

Eight touchscreen information kiosks in the lobby offer maps to guide patrons through the new court tower and to other campus buildings with turn-by-turn directions, floor-by-floor maps, and English and Spanish text. Patrons can also use the kiosks to find their courtroom by performing a docket search by their name or case number, and view case details.

Prospective jurors will check in on 18 electronic touchscreen kiosks, then monitor their status on 44 overhead LCD screens throughout the jury assembly area. As court personnel select jury panels, the displays identify empaneled jurors and direct them to assembly areas for further instruction from bailiffs before beginning the jury selection process.

The electronic kiosks and wayfinding displays are driven by the Infax CourtSight Suite, with a data interface to the county's case management software and jury management software from ACS.

The new facility, which was completed on schedule and under budget, will open to the public Tuesday, February 21st, with juror check-in kicking off on February 28th.
